

Qualifications

Store To Door clients make a decision they can no longer get to the grocery store, push a cart around a large store or lift their own groceries.

We serve adults 60 and older who can:

- Generate a grocery order over the phone, working with an order taker.
- Receive groceries delivered into their home during our mid-day delivery window.
- Pay for the groceries (and delivery contribution, where appropriate).



What will it cost me?

- All clients pay for their groceries (we accept checks, credit/debit cards or EBT).
- Clients are asked to make a contribution toward the cost of delivering the groceries. No client pays the full cost of delivery.
- Delivery contribution is determined when registering; it's based on reported age, household size and income. A sliding scale is set based on Federal Poverty level guidelines.
- No one age 60 or over is denied service if unable to pay delivery contribution.

Alternative Care and Elderly Waiver approved.

Who we are

Store To Door is a non-profit grocery shopping and delivery service that shops for and delivers groceries to over 1,400 homebound elderly adults each year.



Our customers

- Live in all seven counties within the Twin City metro area.
- Live in their own single family homes, in apartments and condos and in assisted living facilities.
- Are most frequently elderly women living alone who are able to cook for themselves but, for many reasons, are unable to shop for and bring home their own groceries.
- Have varied income levels.

How we serve

Regular personal contact with every client:

- Friendly order taker calls on a set day to take the order
- Volunteer shopper “shops” each order individually and calls with questions
- Delivery staff brings groceries directly into the kitchen.

Easy phone registration process.

Order from complete selection of product in Cub Foods.

Process

- Every other week, volunteer order taker calls client to take order.
- Grocery order is shopped by volunteers at one of five metro area Cub Foods stores.
- Store To Door delivery staff delivers the order along with an itemized grocery receipt to client’s kitchen.
- Manufacturer coupons redeemed.
- Prescription delivery from Cub pharmacy available.
- Payment for groceries and any delivery contribution made by using a personal check, credit/debit card and/or EBT card at time of delivery.
